**“Set Your Affection”**

**Colossians 3:1-11**

Since we have been “*Risen*” with Christ, let us leave behind old ways, habits, values and vices. Let us seek the resurrection power, godly virtues and victory over sin that is from up above. This will require us to run this race on purpose & with \_\_\_\_\_.

**I. Run on Purpose...**

**I Corinthians 9:19-27**

The Apostle Paul appears to have his priorities in order. He focus/affection is “...for the gospel’s sake...” v23 and to run that he may obtain an incorruptible crown. That in the end he would not be a castaway v27.
